Resource efficiency is a guiding principle for EU policies in the fields of energy, transport, climate change, industry, raw materials, agriculture, fisheries, biodiversity, water and waste management, land use and regional development. The flagship initiative "resource-efficient Europe" aims to establish a close link between economic development, social well-being and a responsible use of natural resources.

Regions and cities have an important role to play in fostering resource efficiency. They invest in green buildings, sustainable water and waste management, reduce greenhouse gas emissions by promoting cleaner modes of transport, and in protecting ecosystems. In the Covenant of Mayors, over 4,000 local and regional authorities in the EU have committed themselves to increase energy efficiency and the use of renewable energy in their respective territories.

On 2 and 3 September 2013, the Committee of the Regions will hold a conference on local approaches to resource efficiency in Vilnius, Lithuania, with the support of the Lithuanian Presidency of the EU. The event will be combined with a meeting of the CoR's Commission on Environment, Climate Change and Energy (ENVE) and a meeting of the CoR Bureau in Vilnius. It will focus on two aspects:

- Resource-efficient Europe: policy challenges for regional and local authorities;
- Local perspectives for a sustainable energy sector Europe 2020 and beyond.

The event forms part of a series of seven conferences, the Committee of the Regions is organising on the seven flagship initiatives of the Europe 2020 strategy in 2012/13. In spring 2014, the series will culminate in the 6th European Summit of Regions and Cities including a midterm assessment of the Europe 2020 strategy from the Committee's perspective.

The conference targets representatives from regional and local authorities, EU institutions, private and financial institutions, social partners and civil society. Participation is free of charge.
