PRESIDENT OF REGIONAL COUNCIL PAGANO MEETS PRESIDENT BARROSO CALLING ON INTERMEDIATE REGIONS AND IMPROVED DIALOGUE ON IMMIGRATION

President of the Regional Council of Abruzzo, Nazario Pagano, as President of the Conference of European Regional Legislative Assemblies (CALRE), attended a meeting in Brussels between the presidents of associations representing local and regional authorities, the President of the Committee of the Regions, Mercedes Bresso, and the President of the European Commission, José Manuel Barroso the last 16th of June.

The meeting happened only two weeks prior to the unveiling of the **post-2013 EU financial** framework and gave to the local and regional leaders the opportunity to urge the European Commission to acknowledge the **Lisbon Treaty** 'upgrade' for regions and cities in the discussions on the **cohesion policy** and the future EU budget as well as on the **Europe 2020 strategy**.

Attended to the meeting the President of Committee of the Regions Mercedes Bresso, the First Vice-President of the Committee of the Regions and President of the Murcia region Ramón Luis Valcárcel Siso, il Presidente della Conferenza delle regioni periferiche marittime (CRPM) Jean-Yves Le Drian, Presidente della regione francese della Bretagna, il Presidente della Conferenza delle regioni europee con potere legislativo (REGLEG) Jean-Luc Vanraes, ministro della regione di Bruxelles-Capitale e responsabile per le Finanze, il bilancio e le relazioni esterne, la Copresidente del Consiglio dei comuni e delle regioni d'Europa (CCRE) Annemarie Jorritsma, sindaco della città olandese di Almere, il Presidente dell'Associazione delle regioni frontaliere europee (ARFE), Karl-Heinz Lambertz, primo ministro della Comunità di lingua tedesca del Belgio ed infine la Presidente dell'Assemblea delle regioni d'Europa (ARE), Michèle Sabban, vicepresidente della regione francese dell'Ile-de-France.

During his intervention Mr Pagano said: "In support to the position expressed by the European Parliament on 8 June, the European Commission should introduce a category of "intermediate Regions" whose level of per capita GDP is between 75% and 90% of the EU average, for the future planning period of European structural funds. In the light of the recent Mediterranean crisis, recognition of a "common European border" and an appropriate revision of the Schengen provisions would be desirable. On behalf of the many CALRE Regions having to deal with migratory flows, I call on the European Commission to continue its dialogue with the Southern Mediterranean countries on the themes of migration, mobility and security."
